What is the story behind your stud name and essentially your brand that you are putting in to the market place?

I'm no expert, however I do have a vision and a story to tell.

During my school years I developed a deep love for farming, stock, the seasons and rural folk. Brought up in a village on the edge of Dartmoor in the South West of England, I spent any spare time I could working on local farms, milking, hay making and all that goes with things farming. However it was only when arriving in New Zealand that the passion could be outworked.

So what is the link? Have a look at the logo – you see the Hereford bull – a symbol of England, miniature for me only because we get so wet here on the outskirts of Wanganui. The tree is a significant tree on our property, with the Church being from the 16th Century in that very village I was brought up in – Tamerton Foliot. Thus the Tamerton.

The story continues as all the offspring are named after farms, rivers and places local to the village.

While the stud is no money maker, the pleasure derived is immense with the theme progressing to a Suffolk sheep stud, again a very English breed. Both studs help market the English themed farm stay, where we host visitors from all over the world and many young NZ families.

A tribute

Janet Poole 1944 – July 2018

It is with deep sadness we're writing of the passing of Janet Poole at the age of 73 years in July this year. She will be sorely missed by her family and those who knew her.

From when Janet was a very young child, she always had an affinity with animals. It wasn't unusual for her mother to find Janet's bedroom hiding shoeboxes and larger boxes with some creature inside it, that she had rescued to nurse back to health for eventual release. Her father was a partner in crime for Janet's collection -- because secretly he wanted to be a wildlife officer instead of a dairy farmer.

After Janet started secondary school, she developed an interest in zoology and biology with the intention of having a future career as a veterinarian. Becoming a vet, however, meant a possible move to Australia as there were no vet schools in New Zealand at the time. Moreover, her father wasn't prepared to back his daughter's proposal. Instead, Janet was given an opportunity to work as a vet nurse in a small practice, as well as being trained by the vets and very quickly learned that a call-out at 2am asking for her help was part of the job, whether it was a small or large animal call-out. Apart from a lifelong interest in animals, Janet also completed a "Bachelor Of Education" and developed a deep interest in the education of children with special needs.

After an involvement in farming cattle for some years and two shockingly wet winters in 2007 and 2008, Janet mentioned miniature Herefords to her husband in fun who said they would be worth a try. In 2009 Janet purchased and started breeding miniature Herefords under the stud prefix Riverlets Miniature Hereford Stud. Some of the progeny Janet bred were successfully shown at local A&P shows with the help of her youngest daughter and close family friends.

Janet will be remembered for her generosity, spontaneity and giving personality as well as her immense contribution to many other's lives and activities.

Janet's family would like to thank everyone for their messages of support and words of kindness.

A Tribute from Barry Huston

It is with great sadness that I inform of the passing of Janet Poole of Matakohē. Janet was a passionate and active member of the New Zealand Miniature Hereford Breeders Group. Her constant concern was to ensure that the Miniature Herefords were true to the regulations and were good quality animals. In an endeavour to achieve this she imported a number of semen straws from renowned Miniature Hereford breeders in the United States of America.

She also wanted to develop polled miniature Herefords. In an endeavour to do this and to improve the New Zealand herd quality, she obtained smaller standard breed registered Hereford cows and mated them with registered miniature bulls. The progeny were as anticipated, polled, met the regulation requirements for height and were quality animals.

She lobbied to have these animals recognised and as a result a grading up programme was introduced, that after several generations of recorded breeding, allowed the resultant offspring to be registered.

Janet, along with her husband Ray were very experienced Hereford cattle breeders. They were so knowledgeable and always willing to pass on any helpful information. She was also a great writer and often penned articles for magazines and was a regular contributor to our own NZMHBG newsletter. She will be sorely missed as a major contributor to the wider Miniature Hereford industry and as a great friend to many.

WHY YOU SHOULD RECORD AND REGISTER YOUR MINIATURE HEREFORDS

For the person who produces top quality cattle, efficiently and scientifically – an animal without pedigree has not only a limited price but is bred on a limited background.

A purchaser cannot afford to be in the dark about the next bull he is to purchase or the quality of the heifer or cow he is about to use. They want to be sure of buying quality and the bloodline of their choice. Why then would they settle for an animal without any pedigree when a small additional outlay can buy an animal with proven pedigree background?

When you buy with pedigree papers you are confirming what you see, it tells you this animal is the product of years of selection for desirable Hereford traits. By breeding to known pedigrees an animal has the edge over its counterpart as its chances of producing calf after calf with desired essentials is far greater due to known heritable traits and genetic background. Heritability is predictable and it is therefore most important for a breeder to have documentation of traits and bloodlines.

Miniature Hereford owners are purchasing stock with pedigrees, why then would you not consider registering your progeny. There are still breeders who are doing just this.... and still expect their animals to be in demand and fetch good prices. Joining the Hereford Association and being a member of the NZ Miniature Hereford Breeders Group gives you the power to register and keep data on your stock. It is strongly recommended that you take this option for your herd.

How to register

Fill out your calf entry forms (available at NZHA or ask Helen for one)

What you need to fill in is....

Name & rego number of Dam and Sire

Date of calf birth

Tag No. ie...04 (for year) 023 (number of calf) 04/023

Stud Name and animal name ie...Esprit Milly 04/023

Sex of calf

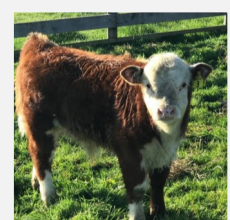
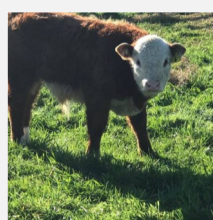
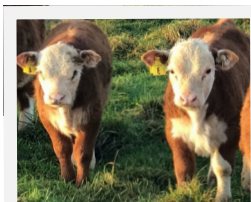
No. in birth - ie. One

Horned animal

Calving ease 1,2,3,4,5 - ie. 1 is had calf on her own no trouble, 2 is had to assist her in calving (easy pull), 3 is had to assist (hard pull) etc...

Weight of calf (within first 12 hours) (optional but important for data)

None of the above information is hard to find, if you have trouble filling in this form please ask someone on the council for help. Registering your calves will make a difference to your herd in the long run.

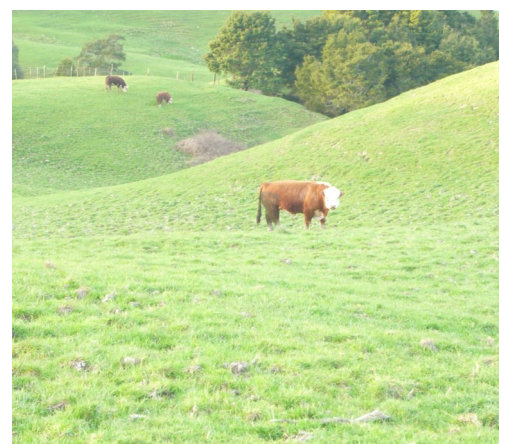
